Subject – Verb – Predicate

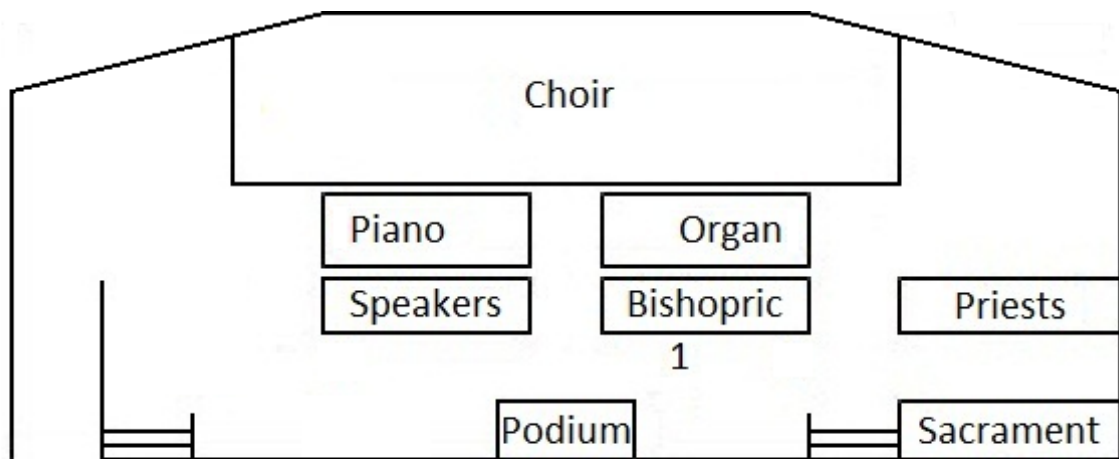


God Blesses, we administer

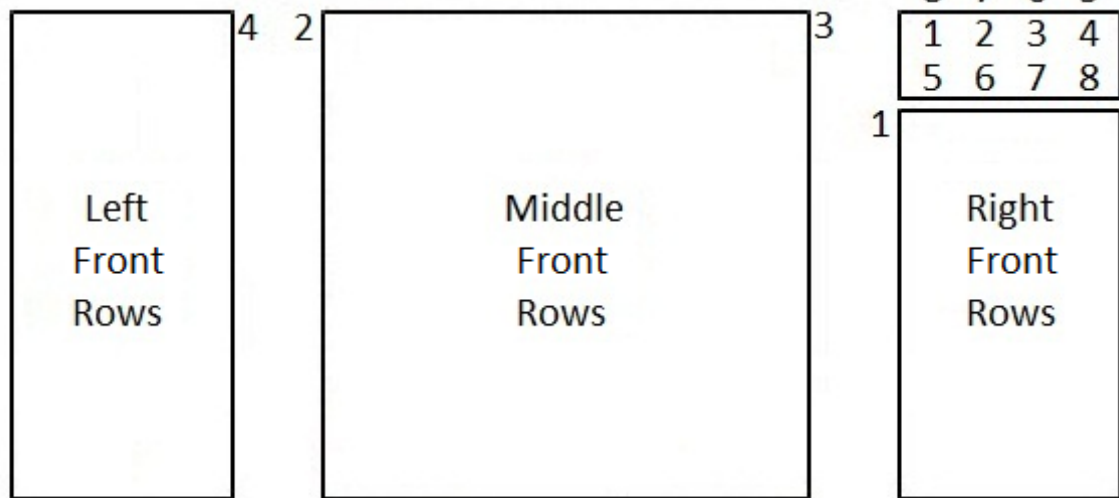
We – ask – bless water
they – do it / remembrance – blood
they – witness / remember – him
they – may have – Spirit.

- D&C 20:77 vs. Moroni 4:3. Moroni uses ***hath***, while D&C uses ***has***. We use ***has*** and ***water***.
- Count the word “***and***” in each prayer. Why the difference?
- Common mistakes:
 1. Confusing bread and water.
 2. Skipping lines like “and keep his commandments...”
 3. Adding “***it***” in “That they may eat ***it*** in remembrance...”
 4. Adding words like “***always***.”
 5. Leaving out words like “***of***” in “drink ***of*** it.”

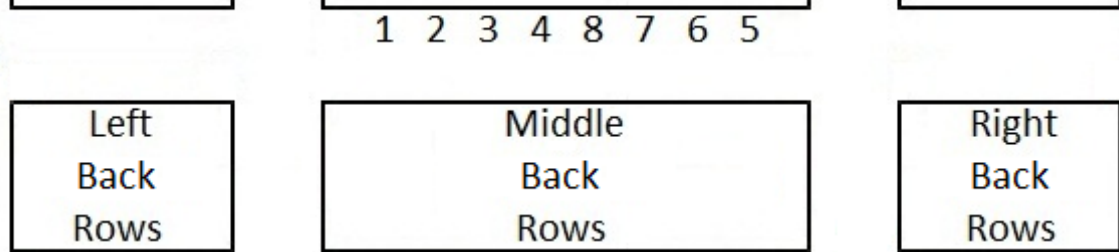
